REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION OF THE EDUCATION SPECIAL CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

Jurisdiction and Procedural History

Pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 2.2-4019 and 54.1-2400(10), the Education Special Conference

Committee ("Committee") of the Virginia Board of Nursing ("Board"), held an informal conference on

April 16, 2024 in Henrico County, Virginia, to inquire into evidence that America School of Nursing

and Allied Health Practical Nursing Education Program ("Respondent"), may have violated certain laws

and regulations governing the operation of practical nursing education programs in the Commonwealth

of Virginia.

Present at this proceeding on behalf of Respondent were: Esi Gyenin, R.N., MSN, Program

Director; Wade Sheriff, BSN, R.N., Faculty; Gabrielle Sarpony, BSN, R.N., Faculty; and Joseph

Agyemang, Librarian.

Upon consideration of the evidence, the Committee makes the following Findings of Fact and

Conclusions of Law and recommends that the Board adopt the following Order.

Recommended Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

1. America School of Nursing and Allied Health Practical Nursing Education Program

("Respondent"), was granted approval to operate a practical nursing education program on October 14,

2015.

- 2. Respondent violated 18 VAC 90-27-210(A) and (B) of the Regulations for Nursing Education Programs in that its passage rate for first-time test takers of the NCLEX ("passage rate") was below 80% for three consecutive years. Specifically, in 2021, the passage rate was 53.66%; in 2022, the passage rate was 60%; and in 2023, the passage rate was 73.91%. On February 2, 2023, Respondent was placed on conditional approval status by the Board after two consecutive years with a passage rate below 80%.
- 3. At the informal conference, Respondent's representatives were well-prepared, were able to speak to the program's plan moving forward, and how they quickly developed an action plan based on their deficiencies.
- 4. All Respondent's representatives present were able to answer questions from the Board. They worked as a team.
- 5. Respondent's representatives described how they use educational support products to monitor students' progress as well as make changes to the curriculum based on cohort data. They also described how they used their educational support products to ascertain whether students were ready to progress to subsequent courses. Students are now required to meet certain benchmarks in the educational support software as well as passing the coursework and exams.
- 6. Respondent's representatives described making a recent change to their admission criteria based on their entrance exam results.
- 7. Respondent's representatives also spoke to intervening with at-risk students earlier in the program.
- 8. Respondent's representatives described how they have instituted incentives for taking the NCLEX sooner after graduation.

Recommended Order

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Committee recommends that the Board issue an Order as follows:

- 1. America School of Nursing and Allied Health Practical Nursing Education Program ("Respondent") is continued on CONDITIONAL APPROVAL contingent upon its 2024 and 2025 passage rates meeting or exceeding 80%.
- 2. Respondent shall submit to a survey visit by the Board in 2024. Board staff will coordinate the survey visit date.
 - 3. Within 60 days of the date of entry of this Order, Respondent shall:
- a. Provide a copy of this Order to all current and prospective students, to all faculty members, and to the program's advisory board.
 - b. Publish this Order on its website.
- c. Update all publications and promotional materials to reflect that Respondent is on conditional approval.
- 4. Respondent shall comply with all the Board's regulations for maintaining an approved practical nursing education program in Virginia.
- 5. Upon review of compliance with the terms and conditions of this Order, the Board will further consider Respondent's approval status, which may require its appearance before a Committee of the Board.
- 6. Any violation of the terms and conditions of this Order or any law or regulation affecting the operation of nursing education programs in the Commonwealth of Virginia may constitute grounds for the withdrawal of approval of Respondent, and an administrative proceeding shall be convened to determine whether such approval shall be withdrawn.
